## Helter skelter meaning

He later became one of the most famous Beatles songs, after Charles Manson played it as a symbol of Armageddon. The sound, which was described as a prototype for the 70's heavy metal sounds, was an attempt to overcome The Who; in an interview, Pete Townshend had described their single 'I Can See For Miles' as the most extreme sound of the group until today. I stayed in Scotland and read in Melody Maker that Pete Townshend said: "We have just made the most raunchiest rock album, stronger and ridiculous that you have ever heard." In fact, I never found out what trace was that the Chi had done, but this made me go; Just hear him talk. So I told the boys: "I think we should make a song like this; something really wild." And I wrote 'Helter Skelter'. You can hear the voices that crack, and we played it so long and so often that at the end of the You can hear Ringo saying, 'I have blisters on my fingers'. We just tried to make it stronger: "Can't we make the drums sound stronger?" This was really all I wanted to do – to make a very strong rock record and raunchy 'n' roll with the Beatles. And I think it's pretty good. 'Helter Skelter' referred to a mainly popular fairground race in Britain, where people could climb the inside of a wooden tower and slip down a spiral walk outside. I was using the symbol of a helter syclist as a ride from the top down – the rise and fall of the Roman Empire – and this was the fall, the end, the descent. You might think about it as a pretty title, but it has since been taken on all kinds of ominous shades because Manson took it as an anthem, and since then a nice couple of punk bands have done it because it is a raunchy rocker. Paul McCartney Many years ago, Barry Miles In the United States the term "skelter helter" was much less known. Charles Manson, the psychopath who in 1969 led his family to perform a series of murders. To him, 'Helter Skelter' was a prophecy encoded for an apocalyptic race war. Charles Manson interpreted that 'Helter Skelter' was something to do with the four horsemen of the Apocalypse. I still don't know what all this is; it's from the Bible, Revelation – I haven't read it so I don't know. But he interpreted everything – that we were the four knights, 'Helterit was the song – and he came to have to go out and kill everyone. During his murder trial in November 1970, Manson explained his interpretation of 'Helter Skelter' to the court. 'Helter Skelter' means confusion. Literally. Doesn't mean no war with anyone. It doesn't mean those people are gonna kill other people. It just means what it means what you want. It's not my conspiracy. It's not my music. I hear what you mean. He says, 'Rise!' Says 'Kill!' Why blame me? I didn't write music. I'm not the person who projected it into your social consciousness. Since 1968 The Beatles had become entertained by the often imaginative interpretations applied to their songs. John Lennon encouraged to play such a thought on 'Glass Onion', also on the White Album, and several other songs referred to the group. However, they were shocked by the effect that 'Helter Skelter' had on Manson and his followers. Once we laughed at this, that or the other, lightly, and some intellectuals read us, a symbolic generation of youth wants to see something in it.
