And when accompanied by writing recordings, old photographs and tapes of long-lost interviews, the interest of any viewer multiples immediately. These are books, movies, podcasts or series, the real criminal genre is seen everywhere currently. Even Netflix, the online streaming giant, has no shortage of such titles in its exhaustive catalog. These shows can be about anything; they can involve newly discovered files on famous killers or discovering new pieces of evidence on old, cold cases. Whatever the theme, the documentaries on the murder never cease to amaze us. And so today, we compiled a list for all those addicts who want to bin on some really good and high-quality docu-series on Netflix right now. So, here's the list of really good murder documentaries on Netflix that are available to broadcast right now. 13. Making a murderer (2015) Making a murderer is a real documentary of the American crime that had taken the Internet from storm on its release. After more than 15 years, it is Steven Avery's true story, based in Wisconsin, who was mistakenly accused of the sexual assault and attempted murder of Penny Beertsen and had to serve 18 years of prison since his arrest in 1985. Two years after his release, he was again accused of the murder of Teresa.Another suspect and convicted in this case was Brendan Dassey, Avery's nephew. Season 1, which was released in 2015, concerns events surrounding Avery's arrest in 1985, his release in 2003, his second arrest in 2005, and his arrest, prosecution and conviction of Brendan. The second season explores Avery's failure to stop his family, being framed with murder and coercion of his confession by the prosecutors. You can watch this show here. 12. Amanda Knox (2016) This documentary distributed by Netflix dives into the complex case of Meredith Kircher's murder in 2007, while focusing on Amanda Knox, an American exchange student who was associated with the victim and therefore a serious suspect. At only 20 years, she was convicted and spent four years in an Italian prison for a murder she didn't commit. With a sumptuous combination of archive footage and interviews from people connected to occurrence, Amanda is ready to tell her story to the world, a disastrous accident that will attract your attention without doubt. Look at this. 11. Evil Genius (2018) Evil Genius is a 4-part Netflix Original series of 2018 that documents the murder of Brian Wells in 2003. This case is also commonly referred to as the "collective bomb" or "pizza bomber". When Wells was killed during a bank robbery after the detonation of an explosive collar that was forced to lock his neck, producer and narrator Trey Borzillierinvestigate the case when you received evidence that suggested this could have been a planned murder. He began correspondence with Marjorie Diehl-Armstrong in 2005 while still in prison and extracted several vital information about this cold case. You can watch this show here. 10. The disappearance of Madeleine McCann (2019) The disappearance of Madeleine McCann is an 8-part docu-series that debuted on Netflix in 2019 and documents the highly publicized disappearance of Madeleine McCann, three years ago, when he was on holiday with his family in a resort in Portugal in 2007. Until the date, there is no information about where it is. In this documentary, we are given a detailed look on the case, where filmmakers Emma Cooper and Chris Smith conduct interviews with the authors of the book 'Looking for Madeleine', Portuguese police officers who were involved in the case, and tourists staying at the same resort of the family of Madeleine at that time. I am a murderer (2018) We are already familiar with tons of real crime shows that focus on cases from the point of view of the investigator and the victim or the family. But Netflix's 'I Am a Killer' allows viewers to experience crimes as a first-hand account by the same authors. The first season of this documentary, which debuted in 2018, focuses on 10 death row holders on its 10 episodes path. Each episode explores how a particular offense ended up committingmurder and his story. While some are quite frank for events surrounding cases, others adopt a more mysterious approach. Overall, the brutality and blur of this show make it a must-watch for real-crime docu-series enthusiasts. You can watch this show here. 8. The Innocent Man (2018) 'The Innocent Man', an American documentary television series, premiered on Netflix on December 14, 2018. This is an adaptation of John Grisham's non-fiction book, 'The Innocent Man: Murder and Injustice in a Small Town' written in 2006. The first season includes 6 episodes and tells the strange events surrounding two murder cases in Ada, Oklahoma, committed between 1982 and 1984. For some reasons, the offenders Ron Williamson, Dennis Fritz, Tommy Ward and Karl Fontenot had given false confessions. And the documentary only explores this, which raises many more interesting questions. You can watch this show here. 7. Wormwood (2017) Wormwood, who debuted on Netflix on December 15, 2018, is a 6-episode docu-series that follows the life of the American scientist of biological war and CIA officer, Frank Olson, who mysteriously died in 1953. He was suspected of participating in a governmental biological war program (MKUltra Project), without his knowledge. The story is narrated by his son Eric Olson. After Frank was dosed with LSD by his CIA chief as part of the project, he reported suicide throwing himself from theRoom window hotel, 9 days post accident. However, new fragments of evidence and follow-up investigations suggested that it could actually be murder, as for the director errol morris, "What wormwood tries to do is tell a story about how we know and how reliable that knowledge is." The Israeli series "Shadow of Truth" was originally presented on the Israeli hot8 channel in March 2016, on 27 January 2017 was published for the international public by netflix. This award-winning documentary is about the murder of the 13-year-old tair rada girl, whose body was discovered in her school bathroom. Further investigations led to the arrest and trial of Ukrainian migrant roman zadorov, who was employed at school, each episode of this 4-part series explores a different aspect of the case: Episode 1 deals with the version of the police and prosecution, according to which zadorov is guilty; Episode 2 focuses on the zadorov defense team, the next episode explores the theory of social media that tair classmates were the real culprits; Episode 4 details the testimony of a man who claims that his ex confessed to the murder on the day of the accident, having a real-time vision in the defects of the judicial system, "Shadow of Truth" had received a broad critical applause at its release. You can watch this show here. 5. ted bundy tapes (2019) another docu-series thatrather a social media movement is the Netflix Original, 'Conversations with a Killer: The Ted Bundy Tapes, which was released on 24 January 2018. This series of 4 parts brings to the small screen for the first time over 100 hours of interviews and archive footage of the infamous serial killer Ted Bundy. He also interviews with his family, witnesses, relatives, friends, surviving victims, and members of the law enforcement agencies who had worked on his case. Each episode covers Bundy's life, from his childhood to his crimes, arrests, escapes and final death. Accompanied by archival footage, police evidence, personal photos, and interviews by Stephen Michaud in 1980, The Ted Bundy Tapes offers for an intriguing watch. You can watch this show here. 4. The custodians (2017) Another series of American docu received a wide critical acclaim and raised questions about sexual abuse within the church is the 7-episode show, 'The Keepers', which was released on Netflix on May 19, 2017. It is the unresolved assassination of Sister Cathy Cesnik, a nun who taught English and drama at Archbishop Keough High School, Baltimore. His body was then discovered in a dumpster on the outskirts of Lansdowne and the case remained unresolved until today. As with his students, the authorities covered the case because A. Joseph Maskell, a school priest, was involved. Apparently, he was guilty of sexual abuse of girls' students and Cesnik came to know. This knowledgeHe brought his last murder. Creating a lot of controversy about his release, 'The Keepers' draws inspiration from the terror of rivting, real life and tries to expose long-awaited and strange secrets while narrating the story in an interesting and brilliantly assembled way. Women Killer with Piers Morgan (2016) In this British documentary, journalist Piers Morgan travels to several prisons and meets with murdered women to understand what led them to commit such crimes. It was first released on ITV in May 2016 and included two episodes. One of the offenders here is Erin Caffey, whose mother and two brothers were murdered in 2008 by her boyfriend Charlie Wilkinson and her friend Charles Wade. Surprisingly, after further investigation, it was discovered that Erin was the mind behind the murders. Another case concerns Rebecca Fenton, who killed her husband so as to claim her \$1 million insurance. Another criminal is Amber Wright, who was involved in the murder of his 15-year-old boy, along with his 16-year-old brother, Michael Bargo. During each interview, Morgan's only purpose is to discern what the motivation for these women to commit such serious crimes would be. You can watch this show here. 2. Nurses who kill (2016) Nurses who kill is a British docu-series crime documenting murders disguised as hospital assistants. Experts, including medical, criminal and psychological officials, to discover the reasons behind these nurses who turn into brutal murderers. One of the cases shown here is Anne Crigg-Booth, who killed 3 patients in a Yorkshire hospital. Malcolm, Webster, who had already killed his previous wife, tried to kill another one using his healing skills. Another incident focuses on Roger Dean, who when caught stealing drugs, killed 10 people setting the hospital on fire. Megan, Haines killed two elderly patients by administering high insulin doses, while Jeannie Miata adopted the same process to kill a 68-year-old Texas woman. Killer Kids (2011) 'Killer Kids': a series of Canadian documentaries, revolves around children who can commit the cruelest murders. A crime related to the occult is about Elyse, 15 years old, who was killed by three male teenagers who are members of a heavy metal band, as a sacrifice for Lucifer. Another 17-year-old boy kills his friend for ten stolen bags of angel dust. According to him, this was under the guidance of Satan. The episodes of "Killer Kids" document several other horrible crimes, which are committed due to psychopathic tendencies, fed by sexual desires or hate, or due to drug abuse. In general, the series provides a thorough analysis of these children who are able to kill. Followeddemonstrate that the reasons and methods behind these actions may vary from individual to individual.
