Reye or RS syndrome is a progressive disorder characterized by brain and liver damage. RS causes enormous fat deposits in the liver and other organs. Â »RS strikes less than one on one million children every year and is almost never seen in adults. Those who develop Reye syndrome tend to experiment with very mild symptoms with complete recovery. Phase three brings the growing gravity of phase one and two symptoms. At this point, patients also develop cerebral edema or brain swelling due to excess liquids; This can lead to a coma. Respiratory arrest is a concern in stage three, even if it is rare. Milano Jovic / Getty Images Stage Four of Reye's Syndrome involves a deeper coma and pupils dilated with a small reaction to light. The liver dysfunction gets worse and fat begins to build in more organs. The five stage progresses quickly from the four stage. Convulsions, multiple organ failure, Ã ¢ and weak or paralyzed limbs can accompany the coma. Step five extremities with hyperammemia, an excessive ammonia in the blood. RS usually occurs shortly after recovery from a viral disease like chickenpox or flu, although it can start from three to five days after the onset. Researchers connect about 90% of cases in children to salicylated drugs. Exposure to chemicals such as diluents of paint and herbicides can also increase the risk of developing RS. These conditions include meningitis and encephalitis, which cause inflammation of the brain, spinal cord, or protective membranes. Tests for some chemicals are made to exclude or confirm known metabolic disorders. The TAC shows swelling in the brain while a lumbar puncture allows doctors to obtain a spinal liquid sample to test infections or anomalies. Blood and urine analysis measures the accumulation of toxins and details on hepatic functionality. Steroids Relieve brain swelling, and hypertonic glucose IV solutions can help during the final stages of RS. If the doctors identify and deal with the RS immediately, patients can completely recover. The time spent between the onset of the RS and the initial treatment is directly related to the quantity of permanent brain damage. When the RS progresses quickly, and the affected person falls into a coma, the overall prognosis is very scarce. In children Reye syndrome is almost always fatal without medical care. The most common complications include poor capacity of attention and memory, visual or auditory disorders, language difficulties and language and movement difficulty. Swallowing problems require language therapy, and children may need to consume only thickened liquids and soft texture foods until swallowing does not improve.
