If you're wondering about the system requirements, it's likely going to be the same as the Steam version of the game, so you'll need at least an Intel Core 2 Quad CPU Q6600, 4GB of RAM, an Nvidia 9800GT or AMD 4870 GPU and 72GB of storage. However, the recommended specs are a Core i5 CPU, a GTX 660 GPU and 8GB of RAM. While the story mode of GTA 5 will be completely free and playable, keep in mind that GTA Online might be a little hard to break into.
