



Best Cheap Voice Recorder - Zoom H1n The Zoom H1n, previously known as Zoom H1, is the best cheap digital voice recorder. It features unidirectional condenser capsules arranged in a 90-degree stereo XY recording format. This portable computer weighs only 59 grams, but packs a large set of features. You can record high-quality 24-bit/96kHz WAV and various MP3 formats. The Zoom H1n has microSD and microSDHC card slots, providing 32GB of storage. Even if you record lossless WAV files that are not compressed they do not "lose" data and thus do not take up more disk space. This should be enough for an interview or music recording (~15 hours of recording at 24bit/96kHz). The microphones can handle up to 120dB (SPL), so you don't have to worry too much about clipping. Zoom even includes a built-in low-cut filter to eliminate pops and unwanted low-frequency rumble. Other features include voice highlight preset, overdubbing, pre-recording, auto-recording and more. Something that may be helpful for some and irritating for others is the requirement to have an external battery instead of a lithium-ion battery. The Zoom H1n runs on two AAA batteries, which is both a blessing and a curse: they can be replaced if necessary, but they are inconvenient to carry around. While we'd like to think that 24-bit audio is far better than 16-bit, from a listening perspective, increasing the bit depth doesn't make much of a difference. Thing is, our ears can barely tell the difference, if at all. However, increasing the bit depth provides more flexibility when editing audio files, effectively providing more information for playback. If you have a recording that doesn't sound the way you want it, a higher bit depth makes it easier to correct. More data in each audio file means you can remove more errors from each individual part of the audio without distorting the overall sound. If you edit your audio tracks seriously, a higher bit depth can come in handy. When it comes to audio quality, anything over 16-bit is unnecessary. The higher bit depth also minimizes quantization noise, which appears as a faint noise when recording. However, the difference in quantization noise between 16-bit audio and 24-bit audio is indistinguishable. Even if such noise shows up in your shots, it can be easily removed in post-processing. See: Important difference between audio and file compression. In the end product, you should be more concerned with how you compress the file than with what bit depth it was written. If your final track doesn't play as a lossless WAV file, data will be lost during the compression process. Does the sample rate matter? Sample rate is the number of times data is sampled per second, or how many data points there are per second in an audio file. The human ear cannot perceive sample rates above 44.1kHz, and anything above that is just overkill. However, larger files and higher sample rates provide more editing flexibility. Every cheap voice recorder has itsample rate, none of which exceeds 44.1 kHz. While this may sound tiny compared to the 384kHz supported by the LG V40, it is absolutely overkill. Our ears aren't sensitive enough to tell the difference between 44.1kHz and 48kHz, let alone anything higher. The maximum sensitivity of

human hearing is 20 kHz. This is also the best case scenario. Most of us will experience some level of noise-induced hearing loss.
