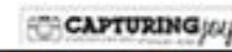

It told the story of soldiers who were stationed in Hawaii before the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor. Difficulty: Easy. Some incorrect choices: Pal Joey, On the Town, High Society Answer: Natalie Wood Interesting Information:Natalie Wood was born Natalia Nikolaevna Zakharenko on July 20, 1938 in San Francisco. She appeared as Susan Walker in 1947's "Miracle on 34th Street". Difficulty: Average. Some incorrect choices: Grace Kelly, Eva Marie Saint, Kim Novak Answer: Tom Hanks Interesting Information:Both "The Da Vinci Code" and "Angels and Demons" were adapted from Dan Brown's books of the same titles. Difficulty: Easy. Some incorrect choices: Russell Crowe, Nicolas Cage, George Clooney Answer: Ben Stiller Interesting Information:In "Night at the Museum", Larry Daley worked as a night watchman at American Museum of Natural History. In its sequel, Ben Stiller reprized his role as Larry. Difficulty: Easy. Some incorrect choices: Adam Sandler, Jim Carrey, Robert Downey Jr. Answer: Mamma Mia! Interesting Information:In "Mamma Mia", Sophie lived on a beautiful island with her mother, Donna. Sophie never knew who her dad was so prior to her wedding, she went through her mother's diary and invited all three possible fathers to her wedding. Difficulty: Easy. Some incorrect choices: High School Musical 3: Senior Year, Hairspray, Rent Answer: Errol Flynn Interesting Information:Errol Flynn played the title role in "Captain Blood" and starred as Capt. Some incorrect choices: Joaquin Phoenix, Ed Harris, Paul Bettany Answer: Miners Interesting Information:"Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs" was released December 21, 1937 and the seven dwarfs mined for diamonds. Difficulty: Very Easy. Some incorrect choices: Teachers, Maids, Cooks Answer: Bullet Interesting Information:Bullet was a German Shepherd dog who starred with Roy in over one hundred movies. Difficulty: Hard. Some incorrect choices: Trigger, Bullseye, Amigo Answer: Statue of Liberty Interesting Information:Taylor is riding along the shore when he sees it, and angrily proclaims, "We finally really did it. Some incorrect choices: Jane Fonda, Brook Shields, Catherine Zeta-Jones Answer: Michael Caine Interesting Information:Based on the book "A Christmas Carol" by Charles Dickens, the Muppet version also featured Kermit the frog as Bob Cratchit, with Miss Piggy as his wife. The film was first released in 1992. Difficulty: Average. Some incorrect choices: Antonio Banderas, Kevin Costner, David Niven Answer: Ice Age 3: Dawn of the Dinosaurs" picks up where the second film "The Meltdown" left off. In the film, Manny, Ellie, Sid and Diego discover that they have been living near a bunch of dinosaurs and must deal with the problems that come with this discovery. Difficulty: Easy. Some incorrect choices: Shrek, Night at the Museum, Batman Answer: Miracle on 34th Street Interesting Information:The original film was released in 1947 and featured the nine-year-old Natalie Wood as the little girl who still believed in Santa Claus. The story was retold a few more times in made-for-TV and theatrical releases. Difficulty: Average. Some incorrect choices: Miracle on 42nd Street, Miracle on 3rd Avenue, Miracle on 5th Avenue Answer: Tim Burton Interesting Information:"Charlie and the Chocolate Factory", based on the book by Roald Dahl, was about a poor boy named Charlie who won a golden ticket, that permitted him to tour inside a magical chocolate factory. Tim Burton directed other films such as "Edward Scissorhands" (1993) and "Sweeney Todd" (2007). Difficulty: Average. Some incorrect choices: Gene Wilder, Steven Spielberg, Martin Scorsese Answer: Labrador Retriever Interesting Information:"Marley & Me" was first a best-selling autobiographical book by John Grogan (2005), and then a Hollywood film starring Owen Wilson and Jennifer Aniston (2008). The incorrect answers are all real breeds. Fila Brasileiro unusual in that they have been purposely bred to "dislike" humans they have not been brought up with...not one to meet in any kind of alley! Difficulty: Average. Some incorrect choices: Korean Jindo, Fila Brasileiro, New Guinea Singing Dog Answer: Alabama Interesting Information:"We lived about a quarter mile of Route 17, about a half mile from the town of Greenbow, Alabama." Tom Hanks earned the Best Actor Oscar in 1994 for playing the title role. He elected not to be paid a salary for the film, but took a share of the profits instead. Clever move. Bill Murray and John Travolta both turned down the role. Difficulty: Easy. Some incorrect choices: Alaska, Arizona, Arkansas Answer: Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec Interesting Information:Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec was one of the most prominent post-impressionist painters of the late 19th century. He was featured in the 1952 film "Moulin Rouge" as played by Jose Ferrer to great acclaim. The movie received seven Oscar nominations including Best Picture and Best Actor for Ferrer. In 2001, John Leguizamo took on the role for the Baz Luhrmann extravaganza "Moulin Rouge!" which also was nominated for Best Picture. Difficulty: Easy. Some incorrect choices: Claude Monet, Jan Vermeer, Pablo Picasso Answer: The Simpsons Movie Interesting Information:"The Simpsons Movie" was finally created, and released in July 2007. It had been something the writers had been interested in doing since the early years of the television show. 7-11 stores were sponsoring the release of the movie by temporarily changing their signage and decor to look like the Kwik-e-Mart, Homer's favourite convenience store. 7-11 also temporarily baked and sold donuts made to look Homer's typical snack - a donut with pink icing and sprinkles. Difficulty: Average. Some incorrect choices: Transformers, Balls of Fury, Hairspray Answer: The Cure For Insomnia Interesting Information:The aptly named "The Cure For Insomnia" has just one artist, L.D. Groban, reading his poem of the same name over the course of the 87 hours. Difficulty: Easy. Some incorrect choices: The Untouchables, Fatal Attraction, Gone with the Wind Answer: The Italian Job Interesting Information:The film, "The Italian Job", was released in 1969 and directed by Peter Collinson. Michael Caine played the part of Charlie Croker and British comedian, Benny Hill, played the part of Professor Simon Peach. Benny Hill also starred as the toymaker in the 1968 film, "Chitty Chitty Bang Bang". Difficulty: Average. Some incorrect choices: The Ipcress File, Alfie, Educating Rita Answer: Robin Hood Interesting Information:Errol Flynn appeared in "[The Adventures of] Robin Hood" (1938) with Olivia De Havilland; Kevin Costner in "Robin Hood - Prince of Thieves" (1991) with Mary Elizabeth Mastrantonio; Patrick Bergin in the made-for-TV "Robin Hood" (1991) with Uma Thurman; and Daffy Duck in the theatrical short "Robin Hood Daffy" (1958) with Porky Pig. Difficulty: Very Easy. Some incorrect choices: Sherlock Holmes, Arnold Schwarzenegger, Hamlet Answer: Monsters, Inc. Interesting Information:Boo, the small girl who accidentally got into Monsteropolis, was voiced by a four year-old girl called Mary Gibbs, as was the character. She was found by Mike Wazowski (voiced by Billy Crystal) and John Sullivan (voiced by John Goodman). Difficulty: Average. Some incorrect choices: Toy Story 2, Ratatouille, WALL-E Answer: Jenny Interesting Information:Jenny Curran, Forrest Gump's friend and eventual wife is played by Robin Wright. The plot has Forrest losing touch with his mate from childhood, reuniting with her, and eventually having a child with her before her untimely death. Difficulty: Easy. Some incorrect choices: Julia, Jackie, Jill Answer: Henry Interesting Information:Indiana is the nickname of archeology professor Henry Jones, Jr., who ditches his nerdy professor get-up in favour of the familiar adventurer outfit and whip while he's out in the field. The character was created by George Lucas and Steven Spielberg. The name "Indiana" came from George Lucas' dog. Difficulty: Easy. Some incorrect choices: John, Peter, Chuck Answer: Transformers Interesting Information:In the Michael Bay-directed 2007 adaptation of the cartoon series, the Autobots defeated the Decepticons and restored stability to Earth and their own planet. In "Transformers: Revenge of the Fallen", the Decepticons come back for vengeance. Shia Labeouf and Megan Fox reprised their roles as the humans who become caught up in the fight between the Transformers. Difficulty: Hard. Some incorrect choices: Beowulf, Gone Baby Gone, The Number 23 Answer: Schindler's List Interesting Information:The film is based on the real story of German businessman, Oscar Schindler, who was able to save over 1100 Jews from death at Nazi concentration camps. All the rest are Rachel Weisz's films. Difficulty: Easy. Some incorrect choices: Constantine, About a Boy, Enemy at the Gates Answer: You've Got Mail Interesting Information:"You've Got Mail" stars both Tom Hanks and Meg Ryan. In this movie Ryan owns a small local book shop and is worried about what might happen to her business when Hanks opens his mega book store in the same area. The movie is a romantic-comedy. "Sleepless in Seattle" also stars both Ryan and Hanks. Difficulty: Hard.
