The Development Manager Junichi Masuda Fired and LeafGreen were announced for the first time in September 2003 as a remake of original Pocket Monsters Red and Green games published in Japan in 1996. [13] The director of the game Junichi Masuda declared that the new titles would have been developed around the idea of simplicity, [14] since the game engine was a slightly modified version of that used in PokÃ©Ã rubino and sapphire poké. As a result, Fired and LeafGreen were made compatible with ruby and sapphire, allowing players to exchange pokÃ© mon between a game and the other. IGN hypothesized that Nintendo expected less demand for new games, or that was limited by the production of the wireless bundled adapter. [19] Although the original games were released as red and blue in North America, the remakes maintained the Japanese names of «RedÃ» and Ã «GreenÃ». [20] Masuda noted him as a choice by him, stating that the leaf represented a peaceful icon, in contrast with the alternative of water, which he saw as a conflict with the fire icon used by the other game. [14] Music The music used in the games has been derived from the classic game consoles, and arranged by IChinose Go. Masuda and Ichinose decided not to change the music reused by the basic background sounds used in red and blue, and instead updating them by adding other sounds. Some tracks have additional changes than the original soundtrack and some tracks like Battle Trainer Music are rewritten in MIDI for the GBA and contain tone curves between the notes. [25] gamespy reviewer phil. theobald, who assigned four out of five stars, said: "before I knew, I was hooked again, the incredibly simple gameplay combined with the most-strategic-that-before-appearing battles was just too much to resist. and yes, the 'cat catch 'em at the gimmick is still effective, not to mention necessary to build a well balanced party: there is only something about tracking, catching and training all those pokémoms that really attract you into the world of the game."
